

Utah Grid Resilience Program



The Utah Office of Energy Development (OED) administers the Utah Grid Resilience Program (GRID 40101d), funded by the U.S. Department of Energy. This grant program is available to any utility serving Utah and will enable improvement and technology adoption that prevent outages while also enhancing the resilience of the electrical grid in Utah.

Grant Description

The Utah GRID program is a competitive funding opportunity with a matching-fund requirement for Utah's large and small utility providers. The total funding pool for this program is \$17,838,148.

Applications are scored based on the applicant's narrative responses. Applicants are required to justify the need for and purpose of the proposed grid resilience project.

Program Eligibility

- Utah's large utilities, defined as entities that sell more than 4,000,000 megawatt hours of electricity per year.
- Utah's small utilities. As defined as entities that sell less than 4,000,000 megawatt hours of electricity per year.

- Utah's Grid Resilience Kick-off Meeting: October 1, 2024
- Submission Deadline: November 1, 2024, 5:00 pm MST
- Grant Awards Notification and Letter of Intent to Award: November 25, 2024



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
