

Utah Grid Resilience Program



The Utah Grid Resilience Program (GRID 40101d), funded by the U.S. Department of Energy under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (IIJA). This grant program aims to enable improvement and technology adoption that prevent outages while also enhancing the resilience of the electrical grid in Utah. Utilities serving Utah are eligible to apply.

Grant Description

The Utah GRID program is a 5 years grant program and is a competitive funding opportunity with a matching-fund requirement for large and small utility providers. Currently, we are going into year 4 of the 5 years funding. More information on the Utah GRID round 3 will be <u>available early Fall of 2025</u>.

Applications are scored based on the applicant's narrative responses. Applicants will get the opportunity to tell stories, identify the need for, and purpose of the proposed grid resilience project in the application narrative.

Program Eligibility

- Large utilities, defined as entities that sell more than 4,000,000 megawatt hours of electricity per year.
- Small utilities. As defined as entities that sell less than 4,000,000 megawatt hours of electricity per year.

Funding Match Structure

- Large utilities required to provide 100% funding match of the requested funding.
- Small utilities required to provide at least 33.34% funding match of the requested funding.
